Collaborating to Manage Risk and Delivery

As **Crown Commercial Service** launch their **£1.2 billion modular alliance** and make awards to their **£30 billion contractor alliance**, it is time to learn how collaborative alliances work in practice and how they can create added value. This one-day conference will explore how strategic thinking and collaborative risk management sit at the heart of safe and efficient procurement.

Speakers and workshop leaders will show how **BIM** is using alliances to integrate data management and how the **FAC-1** framework alliance contract can support integrated procurement initiatives, including the aspirations of **Project 13**. The conference will also look closely at how strategic procurement models support **Modern Methods of Construction** and how procurement evaluation criteria can move away from lowest price and support **improved social value**.

Our keynote speaker **Dr David Hancock, Construction Director** at the **Infrastructure and Projects Authority**, will provide his insights into the Government's construction strategy plus his hands-on experience of innovative risk management on Heathrow Terminal 5.

Professor David Mosey of the **King's College London Centre of Construction Law** will examine case studies from six years' research as to what works, and what does not, when collaborative intentions collide with the harsh reality of potential claims and disputes.
